#### PEACE THOUGHTS ON MARY OF NAZARETH

It is not insignificant that Mary, Queen of Peace, is also Mary of Nazareth and not Mary of Jerusalem, or Mary of Caesarea. The most significant woman of all time came from one of the most insignificant of places. Mary made nothingness visible. It takes a lot of human growing to find value in the valueless—in small places and simple things and powerless people. But that is the basis for peace, both inside of us and in the world around us.

The monastic prayer of Compline always ends with a hymn to Mary. In the Easter season, monastics sing the 'Regina Coeli', or 'Queen of Heaven, Rejoice.' It is amazing that the church's attitude toward Mary has not marked the Church's attitude toward women in general. Perhaps the reason is that we cannot see beyond what culture tells us that women are and so never really come to conversion. Whatever the reason, we all have a lot of 'growing' to do if the woman, Mary, is ever to be seen as God saw women, and saw her.

## GOSPEL THOUGHTS Luke 1:39-56


Once a parent has a child their life is transformed. Good parents reshape their power around the little one.
