THURSDAY 8.50pm PBS AMERICA: THE GOOD NAZI

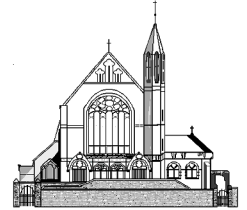
The remarkable story of Major Karl Plagge, a high-ranking Nazi officer, who risked his own life to save hundreds of people.

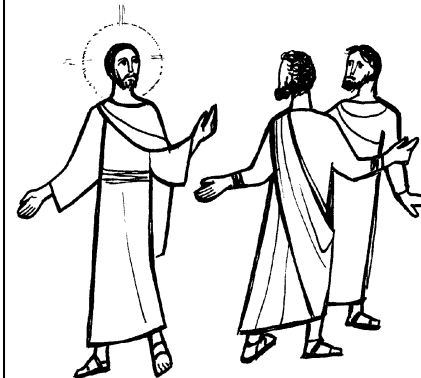
